Scope and Content

Eugene William Farnsworth (1847-1935), was the sixth son of William Farnsworth, of Washington, New Hampshire. Farnsworth worked for the Seventh-day Adventist church his entire life as a minister, evangelist, teacher, and administrator. His places of service include Iowa, Nebraska, the Dakotas, Nevada, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan, Australia, New Zealand, England, Massachusetts, Maryland, and California. He taught at both Union College and Washington Missionary College. Farnsworth married Carrie Eggleston in June 1879. Following her premature death, he married Lizzie Hornby, a tract society secretary. Lizzie died of tuberculosis on July 17, 1891 in Hamilton, Missouri. Farnsworth's third wife was Vesta Cady-Olson.

This collection contains diaries belonging to Farnsworth and his second wife, Lizzie Hornby.
