Scope and Content

Maude Reid (1905-1977) was born in Lenna, Oklahoma. She attended Union College graduating in 1930. According to her obituary, she taught in various Adventist elementary schools in Oklahoma, Texas, and Nebraska including Helen Hyatt Elementary (Lincoln). She died in Omaha, Nebraska in 1977.

This collection is primarily memorabilia from her time as a student at Union College. Also included are handouts, class notes, and homework from a number of her classes.

The arrangement of the collection has been done by the Union College Library Heritage Room.

The collection was given to the Union College Heritage Room by her family specifically her niece, Kay Jordan, in 1993.
