Minnie T. Johnson Proctor Collection

(Collection 23)

Scope and Content

Minnie T. Johnson was born in Fairwater, Wisconsin on July 19, 1872. She attended Union College from 1892-1894. Thereafter she worked as a colporteur and Bible worker. In August 1899 she married Montie R. Proctor and together they ministered in Colorado, New Mexico, Tennessee, New York and Texas. In Texas they spent 22 years in the El Paso area. They retired in Loma Linda, California in 1931. Minnie Proctor died in Loma Linda, on March 16, 1963.

The central piece of this small collection is Proctor's student notebook from a Bible class she took in the fall of 1893.
