Scope and Content

Vernon Scott Dunn was born July 8, 1904 in Sidney, Iowa. He earned a bachelor's degree from Union College in 1942 but he had already been affiliated with the college as manager of the laundry since 1926. He briefly worked at Pacific Union College from June to November 1943, but then returned to Union College to become the assistant business manager. He was promoted to associate business manager in 1948, then became business manager and treasurer in 1950, the postion he held at the time of his death. In 1931 he married Anne S. Devnich who taught Home Economics at Union College for many years. Dunn died May 7, 1963.
