Scope and Content

Lora McMahon was born January 12, 1904. Her father was P. H. McMahon of Wilsonville, Nebraska. After graduation from Wilsonville High School in 1923, McMahon attended nursing school at St Helena Hospital graduating in or around 1925. She used her nursing skills to help many people through the years. McMahon married a pastor, Theron Treat also of Wilsonville, and after attending Union College they served as missionaries in Hawaii. They never had children and divorced in 1942 or 1943. In the late 1940s she married Robert Dennis in Kansas City, Missouri. Dennis died around 1960. Her third marriage was to Mr. King after she moved to Boulder, Colorado. He died after they had been married only a few months. She lived in Boulder until her death on February 1, 1984. She is believed to be buried in Kansas City, Missouri.
