# **Hans Peter Anderson Collection**

## (Collection 6)

### **Scope and Content**

Hans Peter Anderson was born in Wisconsin in 1871. He attended Union College briefly in 1894 and then by his own account went to Denmark for further education in Danish. While in Denmark he helped found a sanitarium and also married Carrie [last name unknown] around 1897. Anderson returned to Wisconsin in 1901 to help his elderly parents run their farm. After his father's death in 1916, Anderson became the farm manager and Bible teacher at Walderly Academy, a Seventh-day Adventist school in Douglas County, Wisconsin. He held these positions from 1918 to 1920. Thereafter he appears to have owned his own farm in Koshkonong, Jefferson County, Wisconsin. The date of his death is unknown at this time.
