Scope and Content

Mertie Wheeler filled multiple positions at Union College in the 1910s-1920s. She was at one time or another the registrar, secretary to the president, and librarian and recalled her father's support for the building of Union College in the 1880's.

Mertie was interviewed by Everett Dick for a Union College history *Union: College of the Golden Cords* in the 1960s and is often quoted in the book.

The collection includes scrapbooks and photographs from the time of her employ at Union College.
